Dear Lake Wylie Marine Commission Stakeholders,

North Carolina Attorney General Josh Stein's office [issued an advisory letter](#) stating that local governments could conduct necessary meetings via electronic communication because North Carolina's Open Meetings Laws do not expressly prohibit doing so. Local governments, however, are encouraged to postpone meetings that are not necessary for immediate ongoing governance.

As we have previously stated, there is no higher priority for the Lake Wylie Marine Commission (LWMC) than ensuring the safety of our stakeholders, constituents, and lake communities. With the continued news alerts and spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19), we want to assure you that the LWMC is closely monitoring the situation and has put procedures in place that follow the Center for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines to ensure the safety of our constituents, stakeholders, and staff.

With this in mind, we are canceling the April 27, 2020 meeting of the LWMC. The Marine Commission will continue its regular duties and provide a full detail of what transpired during March and April hopefully at the May 18, 2020 meeting. We are also exploring the possibility of electronic virtual meetings should the stay-at-home rules be extended.
